

## FERRO-ALASKA GUIDES AND OUTFITTERS

### GEAR LIST *Guided Float Hunt*

NOTE: This gear list is for a guided float hunt for moose during the month of September in Alaska. Hunts for other species at other times of the year will require adjustments in this list. This list is for reference only! Ask your guide about what equipment and personal clothing you'll need for your hunt.

#### Clothing

- Socks, 10 pr. (Smartwool or Thor-lo)
- Underwear, 4-6 pr.
- Long underwear, top and bottom (med. wt. Polypro or equal- 1 pr.)
- Long underwear, top and bottom (lt. wt. Polypro or equal- 1 pr.)
- Pants, 2 pr. (med. wt. wool or 3SP mountain pant) You'll wear one pair and have a spare.
- Tee shirts, 4
- Long-sleeve shirts / sweaters, 3
- Fleece vest or med. wt. pullover jacket or jacket
- Coat, 1 (med. wt.)
- Hat, 2 (1 for the sun and 1 for the cold)
- Gloves, 3 pr (2 lt. wt., 1 med. wt.)
- Rain gear, 1 set (lt. wt. good quality)
- Bandanna or handkerchief, 2

#### Footwear

- Hip boots (smooth rubber uppers)
- Camp shoes, 1 pr. (light hikers or tennis shoes)
- Waterproof socks, 2 pr. (Seal Skinz, Gore tex or similar)
- Blister kit / mole skin

#### Sleeping

- Sleeping bag, 1 (-20° to 0°F rating). Bag should include stuff sack.
- Sleeping pad, 1 (3/4 length X 1.5", lt. wt.)

#### Hunting

- Rifle or bow (use camo tape or other camouflage)
- Hard gun or bow case for travel to Alaska
- Soft or waterproof case for transporting weapon to field

- Ammunition (40 rounds) or arrows/points (18)
- Bowhunters should bring some blunts for grouse.
- Cleaning kit (compact)
- Binoculars
- Spotting scope and tripod (optional)
- Lens cleaning cloth
- Knife (Leatherman tool is best- no large belt knives)
- Sharpening tool
- Pack (must be able to haul at least 40-60 lbs. of gear)
- Rain cover for pack

#### Personal Items

- Water bottles, 2 (one liter size)
- Tooth brush and tooth paste
- Soap, small size
- Wash cloth, 1
- Towel, 1 (small)
- Deodorant, unscented (small size)
- Bug repellent (unscented)
- Sun screen and lip balm
- Glasses / contact lenses
- Sun glasses
- Medical supplies
- Vitamins or supplements

#### Miscellaneous

- Camera and film (bring spare batteries)
- Outdoor repair kit (needle, safety pins, small amount of duct tape, spare pack frame pins, etc.)
- Head lamp & spare bulb / batteries
- Knee / ankle braces if applicable
- Small garbage bags and zip lock bags for clothing and personal gear while on the trail
- Matches or lighter
- Diary and pens
- Reading material

All other items will be provided by your guide. If you have any questions about your gear, don't hesitate to ask before the hunt. All items you take into the field should have a total aggregate weight of 70 lbs. or less, not including your weapon. Avoid cotton clothing and down filled garments / sleeping bags.
